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Head Teacher's Blog A big thank you to you all for supporting us in making some tough decisions this week. Firstly, it was a shame not to have the sports day with Dunster pupils, and it was then a further shame to not include you. I know it must seem excessive to some of you, especially given the scenes at the football, but we have guidance that we have to navigate in schools. Each school has to interpret what is the safest option for their school. Each school has their own intake, their own local statistics, their own intel, their own sites, their own pupils, their own staffing and has to decide with all these unique factors what is the best way to do things. Many schools did not run residential, we did. Many schools last year did not give their year 4s a send off (they were in the year groups at home) we did, in fact we gave them a residential experience on Dunster school field. Many schools did not do a nativity, we did and took our kids to the theatre to make it special! We believe we work hard to make sure the pupil's learning experience is priority. I am sorry if you were disappointed about sports day, but maybe it will reassure you to know, the children had a brilliant time. In many ways the element of competition was reduced this year and the children just had a very relaxed time. On Monday we are awaiting updated guidance, I will stay close to that over the weekend and if anything comes out we will update our risk assessments and alter provision and expectations communicating that to you. We will do so with the following priorities, which we have kept all the way through: safety, wellbeing and then learning. Our number one focus at the moment is getting everyone safely to the summer holiday; pupils, families and staff alike. The last thing we want to occur is to have to close our school or a bubble and for any of our year 4s to miss the opportunity to finish with us and have their leavers service and last few days adversely affected. Thank you for continuing to follow our expectations with regards to being onsite, wearing facemasks etc, until we process the new guidance and let you know of changes. We have always had new guidance at the same time as the general public so please give us chance to adapt and reassess and until we communicate otherwise continue to follow the usual procedures. Little Oaks News

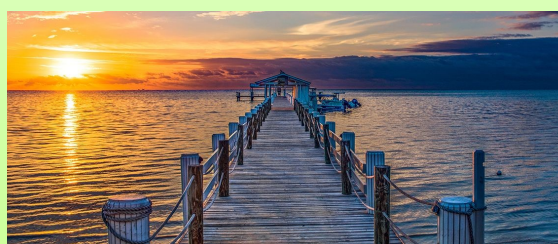

An Extract from Thought for the Week

What brings you joy and meaning? As you write those things down perhaps reflect on the question - if this brings me joy or meaning, am I making enough time for it? If yes, fabulous, that is great. If no, then what steps will you take over the summer and into the new academic year to make it so? Be honest with yourself because these elements, joy and meaning, are our long term safety net, our drivers that help us to achieve a 'fullness' in our lives. We often refer to John 10 verse 10 and Jesus's words about his gift of 'life in all its fullness'. In the first part of the same verse there is mention of 'the thief who comes only to steal, kill and destroy'. Joy and meaning are easily offset by fear, stress, exhaustion, anxiety which, if we do not step out of the arena or the pressure zone, will have a worryingly detrimental effect on us physically, mentally, emotionally. Here are a few Mindful activities to enjoy with your little ones.



The Ice Lolly Challenge

The next time your children are enjoying an ice lolly on a hot day, challenge them to be silent until the lolly has been eaten. Encourage them to really notice all the different tastes (the lollies with 3 flavours are great for this!) What flavours do they notice? Does the lolly start to feel different in their mouth as it begins to melt? What temperature changes do they notice? Was it hard to stay quiet the whole time?

Enjoy the sky!

Lay a blanket down in the garden or at the park and spend some time staring at the clouds. What shapes do they see? Animals? People? Notice how the clouds gently move along, how the shapes merge to make another shape. This is a great way to introduce the idea that our minds are kind of like the sky, our thoughts float around on their own, they change on their own, we can watch the thoughts in our mind as we watch the clouds.



Go for a rainbow walk – go for a walk in the neighbourhood and ask the children to try and spot something they have never really noticed before, or ask them to look for certain colours, this really helps them to become more present to their surroundings, in time this helps them to be more aware of thoughts and feelings that may arise.

Listen out for new sounds, stop and smell flowers and try and notice other smells whilst out on your walk. xxx

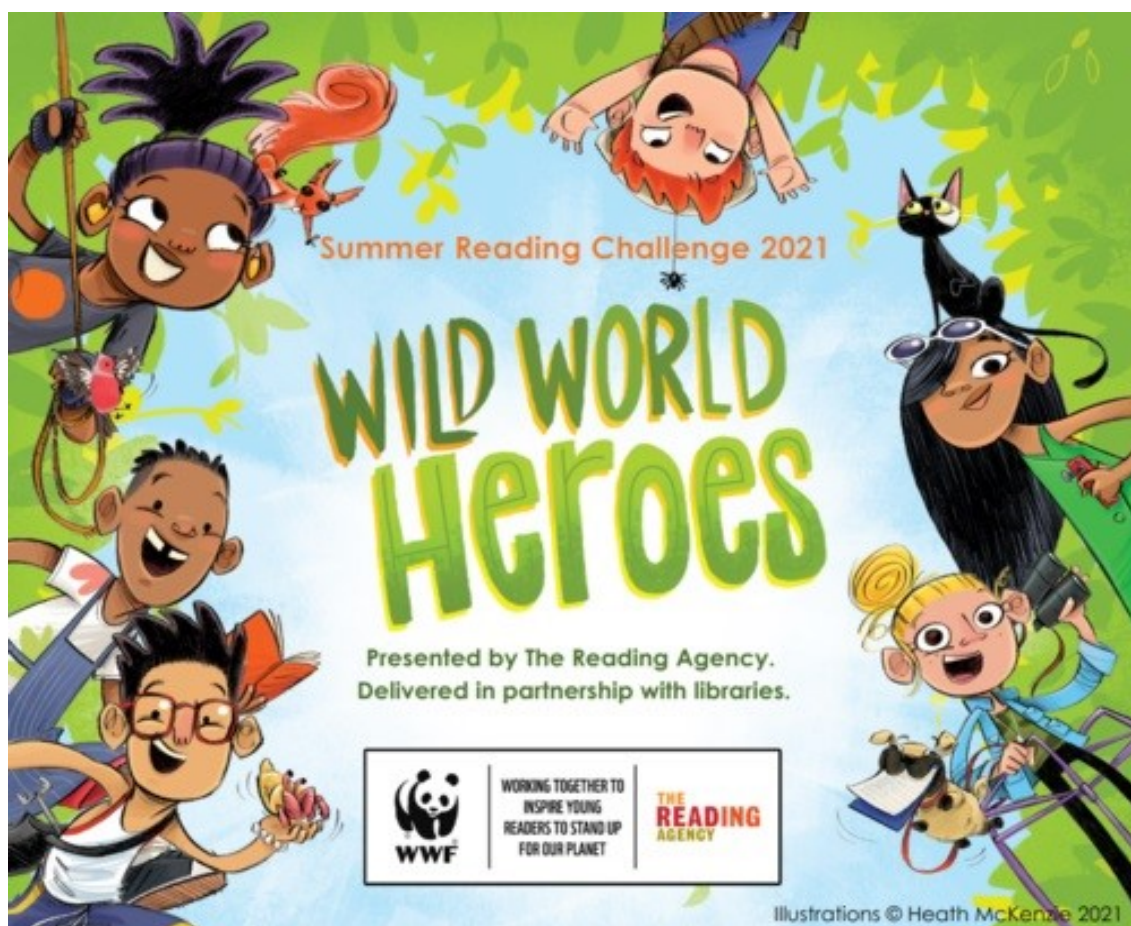

One 24 Hours: One Ocean

Somerset Wildlife Trust and **Stacked Wonky** are on the look-out for 24 young people aged 6 to 18 in West Somerset to create a unique performance for a local beach on 2 and 3 October 2021.

The aim of the performance is to draw attention to the plight of our oceans, and young people's hopes, fears and desires for a life lived in balance with the ocean. Somerset has 74 km of coast and the Bristol Channel that laps its shores is integrally linked to wider oceanic systems and threats. We believe young people's voices need to be heard: the changes they want to see happen have never been so important.

Getting involved will allow young activists, performers and simply the curious to go on a learning journey that helps them translate their ideas and feelings into

performance. This is no ordinary performance: part spectacle, part protest, our young people will perform **on the hour, every hour, for 24 hours** on the sand supported by a professional technical team providing sound, lighting and security. Whether in front of a large audience, the press or alone at 4 am in the morning, each miniature performance (maximum 30 minutes) will have its moment. Any combination of movement, words, music, installation, film, lighting or gadgets can be used to create: we will do our best to support and refine ideas so they have maximum impact.

SWT and Stacked Wonky have teams of experienced environmentalists and performance makers, thus are well equipped to help.

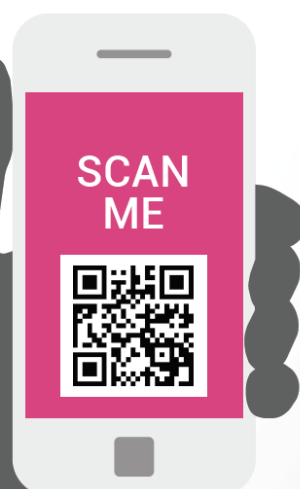
