Dear Parents and Carers,

With the Spring term in full flow, the children have already got stuck into their learning, displays are going up and they are eager to find out what is coming next. We have been talking to all the children about what the curriculum is and asking for their ideas to help us to plan exciting learning opportunities for them.

Class One have started their Great Fire of London History theme and have learnt about how life has changed since 1666. We have been learning about and creating algorithms on the computers and were fascinated by magic colour mixing in art! In literacy we have learnt the story of Puss in Boots and have used adjectives to describe the characters and story settings.

Class Two have had a busy two weeks. They have started looking at a new text in literacy. They have been focusing on the characters and the setting within the Spiderwick chronicles, alongside using dictionaries to find definitions of unfamiliar words in the story. Next week they will be moving on to focus on comparing the real world to the imaginary one.

In geography children have started the new topic which is the mighty earth. They have been using atlases to look at the UK and the physical geographical features. They are looking forward to learning about volcanoes and earthquakes in the coming weeks. In Art children have learnt a story and they have been drawing pictures to match with the scenes in the story.

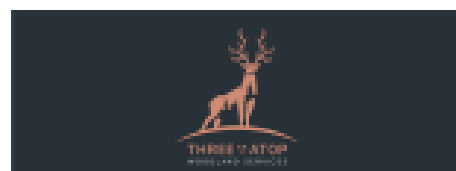
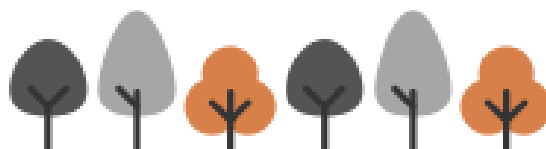
